That there may be peace to your Church and to the whole  
world,  
**We pray to you, O Lord.**

That we may depart this life in your faith and fear, and  
not be condemned before the great judgement seat of Christ,  
**We pray to you, O Lord.**

That we may be bound together by your Holy Spirit  
in the communion of the glorious and ever blessed  
Virgin Mary and all your saints,  
entrusting one another and all our life to Christ.

**TANTUM ERGO:**

Asola (1532-1609)

Thou gavest them bread from heaven.  
**Containing within itself all sweetness.**

hast left unto us a memorial of thy Passion:  
grant us, we beseech thee,  
so to venerate the sacred mysteries of thy Body and Blood,
