O Lord, open thou our lips.

And our mouth shall shew forth thy praise.

of God : the holy place of the tabernacle of the most
Highest.

Palestrina (1525-1594)

were sealed with the Spirit of power.

Lord send us your Spirit.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be Saint Joseph, her spouse most chaste.

Blessed be God in his angels and in his saints.

Psalm 117 is sung:*

O praise the Lord, all ye heathen : praise him, all ye nations.
