



All Saints' weekly email: Baptism of the Lord

Dear Friends,

Last Wednesday a very polite non-believer happened upon us while out walking and stayed for noon Mass. He complimented us afterwards on the beauty of the building and our worship but asked pointedly whether I thought the world had in any way improved since Christ walked the earth (clearly inviting a negative). Thinking of life as a non-citizen in the Roman Empire I could only say I thought things were much better now. Even if you don't accept the contribution of Christianity to ethical, political and cultural life and leaving aside scientific and technological advances, one only has to think of slavery and the poor education, medicine and diet experienced by almost all the population 2000 years ago to make the case, but I couldn't persuade him. He left saying that while he saw no improvement (presumably he meant in people's behaviour?), he was hopeful, but not optimistic. And that is an important distinction: the Gospel deals in hope, as understood in the Judaeo-Christian tradition, rather than the mere optimism of *Candide*.

Still, celebrating the light of the Epiphany and preparing to celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, both feasts which proclaim the Gospel of light and new life, we can't avoid the contrast between this promise and the trouble we see around us, both as a result of the pandemic and the assault on democratic institutions we have witnessed in the USA this week. But I stand by what I said at Epiphany, that this season is a celebration of hope, potential and renewal. We must pray in that hope for the year ahead.

If you were watching the Epiphany Masses you will know that this year blessed chalk was offered to the congregation: it is traditionally taken home from Epiphany Mass to bless our houses. I'll leave some at the back of church on Sunday for any who might like to use it as a sign of thankfulness for blessings received and of our faith and hope for the future (if you can't come on Sunday and would like to bless your house in this way I can send you some instructions!).

While we are extremely grateful that communal worship is still permitted, at least for the time being, it seems prudent to scale back our liturgical offer a little further so as not to create too many opportunities for mingling. For this reason, after this Sunday's **3pm** service, Evensong and Benediction will be **not** be celebrated for the time being. Also the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (*Candlemas*) will only be celebrated with a single Sung Mass on **2 February** at **NOON**.

I have been asked to remind you that we are not supposed to linger after public worship. It seems hard, especially for a congregation which is largely made up of individuals gathering from a distance who naturally want to catch up with friends, but it would be a pity to jeopardise the permission we have been given by giving the impression that our congregation is infringing the rules.

Some of those who were here on Wednesday evening were able to pick up badges supplied by Paul Weston which we can wear to explain why we are out of our homes while travelling to Mass.



This seems an excellent idea: one of our number was stopped by the police and asked why she was travelling on Wednesday evening.

It is suggested that we ask for a donation of £10 for the badges as a fundraiser during this period when church income has been reduced. You can see a photo of the badge (and order one) [here](#). They will also be available at the back of church.
